

POSTER INSTRUCTIONS

Your abstract has been chosen for a poster presentation at the Global Health Recalibration conference “Strengthening Outcomes, Education, Clinical Practice, and Research” to be held 4-6 September 2024 at the Empress Hotel and Convention Center in Chiang Mai, Thailand. By facilitating informal discussions between presenters and their audience, poster sessions provide a more intimate forum for exchange than do regular paper presentations. Ideally, a well-constructed poster will be self-explanatory and free you from answering obvious questions so that you are available to supplement and discuss particular points of interest. Successful poster presentations are those which achieve both coverage and clarity.

CONTENT & COVERAGE

All posters should be displayed in English, the official language of Global Health Recalibration 2024. In terms of content, a good poster will answer the following questions: Have you provided all the obvious information? Will a casual observer walk away understanding your major findings after a quick perusal of your materials? Will a more careful reader learn enough to ask informed questions?

In addition to a **title/author** label and abstract, most successful posters provide brief statements of **introduction, method, subjects, procedure, results** and **conclusions**. Ask yourself, “What would I need to know if I were viewing this material for the first time?” and then state the information clearly.

Topics:

1. *Background*
2. *Objective*
3. *Methods*
4. *Results*
5. *Conclusion*

CLARITY

Is the sequence of information evident? Indicate the ordering of your materials with numbers, letters or arrows, when necessary. Is the content being communicated clearly? Keep it simple. Place your major points in the poster and save the non-essential, but interesting highlights for informal discussion. Be selective. Your final conclusions or summary should leave observers focused on a concise statement of our most important findings.

TECHNICAL SPECIFICATION

Poster presenters, please use a template that can be downloaded [here](#).

File Format: E-poster file should be submitted in JPEG or PDF format in portrait orientation for better resolution on the E-poster Viewer. One page is recommended.

Image and Tables: At least 150 dpi. Good picture quality is essential.

File Size: 1080 (W) x 1920 (H) pixels

Successful Poster Layout: Make sure your poster indicates (a) the title of your study and (b) the author(s) at the top of your poster.

Poster presenter, please submit your files no later than August 29, 2024. Please ensure your file is titled as follows:

POSTER SET-UP

The posters will be organized according to the topic. A list of accepted poster presenters with a map of assigned locations will be distributed as soon as it is ready. We will post the information to the conference website. Please check the conference website for updates. It is recommended that you have a few copies of your references available for distribution should anyone request them.

Selected presentations have been scheduled for Short Oral Presentations. These presentations take place at the E-Poster Area and are presentations of the E-Posters.

Each presenter will be allocated 3 minutes to present their E-Poster, plus 2 minutes for discussion at the E-Poster screens (5 minutes in total). All participants are invited to the E-Poster Stations to hear the short presentations and to ask questions. Each session will be guided by one moderator. Presenters should be at the E-Poster viewing stations 10 minutes before the start of the session and remain there until the session has finished. Presenters are requested to prepare an E-Poster.

Only posters of registered participants will be displayed in the E-Poster Gallery.

POSTER AWARDS

Posters will be considered for awards. Each presenter will be assigned a specific day and time when you must wait for your poster so that you can present for a few minutes to an awards committee representative. This presentation should focus on your results and implementation. Awards will be given for the best poster presentations at the closing ceremony. If you do not wish to be considered for an award, you do not have to be at your poster at the appointed time.

SCHEDULE

The poster presentation schedule is forthcoming but set up and take-down will follow the schedule outlined below.

We ask that authors remain by their poster boards during the assigned poster sessions.
