

**Sarah A Stoddard, PhD, RN, CNP, FSAHM, FAAN**

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Dr. Sarah A. Stoddard is Associate Professor of Nursing and Health Behavior and Health Education at the University of Michigan. She is recognized internationally for her leadership in adolescent health and her interdisciplinary research to prevent substance misuse and violence among vulnerable populations of youth. Dr. Stoddard's research aims to improve our understanding of youth development within adverse contexts and to guide school and community prevention efforts. Dr. Stoddard is the Director of the Training and Education Core for the CDC-funded University of Michigan Injury Prevention Center, Co-Director of Center for the Study of Drugs, Alcohol, Smoking and Health, and Co-Lead of the Data and Design Core for the Eisenberg Family Depression Center. She has served as a mentor and dissertation chair for numerous doctoral and post-doctoral students within the University of Michigan and internationally. Dr. Stoddard serves as an appointed member of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services Community Preventive Services Task Force and was an appointed member of the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine (NASEM) Committee on Improving the Health and Wellbeing of Children and Youth through Health Care System Transformation. She is a Fellow of the American Academy of Nursing and a Fellow of the Society for Adolescent Health and Medicine. She holds a MS and PhD in Nursing from the University of Minnesota and is a certified pediatric nurse practitioner.
